

Clete Yoder, who is also LCF's Everence representative, facilitates LCF's partial reimbursement for some of the assistance we provide, and informs the congregation of opportunities for financial counseling and education. The Benevolence Team welcomes and appreciates the congregation's support and input, and encourages those who feel called to give to our work to do so.
