Called to Be Sent

I recently had the opportunity to spend some time studying the book of Mark with a group of missionaries in the Middle East. One part of Jesus' story that impressed me in a new way was his interaction with his disciples – the way that he called them and what he called them to. In chapter 1, as he walked beside a lake he saw Simon and Andrew. "'Come follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people" (v. 17). Later, when he specifically picked out the twelve disciples from the larger crowd that had begun to follow him, Mark writes that "He appointed twelve that they might be with him and that he might send them out to preach and to have authority to drive out demons" (3:14-15).

I think that it's appropriate – and important – for us to think about our relationship in that same way. He calls us in order to send us out to fish for people. He wants us to be with him AND he wants to send us out to preach (and have authority over demons!) We're called to follow Jesus and be with him. But we're also called in order to be sent out "into the world" – whatever that means for each one of us.

Library Link

What are the first words you think of when you hear or see the word "evangelism"? Are they positive? Negative? Or do you draw a blank? Be inspired and challenged as you learn about inviting people to come to know Jesus. We invite you to take home and read some of the following books.

You will find the books listed below conveniently located in the foyer (on the pub table closest to the library). Instructions for checking out a library book are posted in the library (or check with Linda or Audrey).

- 1. Irresistible Evangelism: Natural Ways to Open Others to Jesus, by Steve Sjogen, Dave Ping, Doug Pollock. Consider learning a friendship approach to sharing with others about Jesus. What's your faith story?
- 2. Speaking of Jesus: How to Tell Your Friends the Best News, by J. Mack Stiles. Take a look at Jesus' and Apostle Paul's examples of sharing Christ's good news. How does this apply to you?
- 3. Inside the Mind of Unchurched Harry & Mary: How to Reach Friends and Family Who Avoid God & the Church, by Lee Strobel. Written in an engaging style as if the author is talking one-on-one with the reader. Is this an area in which you need better understanding and encouragement?
- 4. Life-Style Evangelism: Crossing Traditional Boundaries to Reach the Unbelieving World, by Joseph C. Aldrich. Aldrich declares that "A well-taught, fellowshipping, worshiping person serves automatically. Evangelism for him is not a Tuesday night event; he is on duty twenty-four hours a day" (p.116). Explore the interaction of the individual & church body in learning, healing, responding, and deploying. What does that all mean & how does that apply to evangelism?
- **5. A Time to Pray,** by Evelyn Christenson. Intertwine prayer and evangelism as you are led in a thoughtful and Biblically-based journey. Are you praying for the heart and salvation of people?
- 6. That None Should Perish: How to Reach Entire Cities for Christ Through Prayer Evangelism, by Ed Silvoso. Brother-in-law of evangelist Luis Palau introduces us to his book: "I trust as you read this book, the two-part message of prayer and evangelism being spoken by the Spirit to the Church today will become even more clear to you as you begin to see it in a tangible context" (p. 18). Are you ready to be challenged spiritually as you pray others to Christ?
- 7. Becoming a Contagious Christian by Bill Hybel & Mark Mittelberg. Hybel & Mittleberg write in a conversational, non-threatening manner as they guide us in practical ways to become "Contagious Christians."

Do you need help to be "real" as you invite others to Christ? (Note: Mark Mittelberg will be one of the speakers at Xenos in July.)

Watch for new resources related to evangelism to appear in the basket! After reading from LCF's resources, I wonder if the words you think of when you hear the word "evangelism" will change at all?

When we were living in Thailand it was easy to sense the "sending" part of Jesus' call. We were always surrounded by people who didn't know about Jesus. We knew that interactions with our friends, students, and neighbors were opportunities for the Holy Spirit to speak to them.

As we've partially settled in life in Columbus I've found it more difficult to remember to live out my calling to go, to be sent out. Here where the church is larger, where the opportunities to gather with other followers of Jesus are much more plentiful, it's tempting to focus on the first half of Jesus' commission ("be with him") and forget the last half. But I don't think that we can do that. The movement – the following and being sent is important. If we're not moving in our spiritual lives and if we're not in some way being sent, I'm not sure that we're living up to our calling as disciples of Jesus.

All of us are being sent – and I think all of us are being called to "preach" the good news, to declare that the kingdom of God is near! How we do that will vary - and not many of us will be doing it from a pulpit. But that's fine because most of our not-yet-believing friends, neighbors, and co-workers aren't coming to church anyway. For me, being "sent" to Columbus for these two years means intentionally looking for ways to relate to international students (something that's more comfortable for me since we've lived in Thailand), talking to other parents at our kids' school (something that's not natural for an introvert), and trusting that God will use those interactions. Where is He sending you?
