Why Memorize Scripture?

Recently, a friend got me thinking when she asked me what benefits there are for memorizing scripture. As I pondered her question, I was reminded of how many great reasons there are for us to take the time and effort to hide God's Word in our hearts. When we memorize a verse or passage, the Holy Spirit can bring it to our mind at any time and at any place (even if we don't have wifi connection, light to read, etc. and even if we can't recall it

perfectly word-for-word) to help us fight temptation, to encourage us when we are feeling down, and to help us recognize lies that Satan (and/or others) would like us to believe. He can help us recall verses to use in our prayers or to share with others who are having questions or going through difficult times. Scripture is one of the primary ways that God reveals his will to us—helping us know what he wants us to do or not to do. 2 Timothy 3:16 & 17 says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." That is a priceless tool to have and use!

But...I find it really difficult to memorize—especially since

I am over 50 and have a hard time remembering anything at all! And then, once I finally do get a verse (or section of verses) memorized, if I don't go over it on a consistent basis, it feels impossible for me to recall it a year or two later. That is why I am a big fan of a simple app called Scripture Typer. It is a tool that helps me to overcome my memory challenges so that I am able to hide the treasure of God's Word in my heart. Scripture Typer was the first app that I purchased when I received my tablet for Christmas five years ago, and I have used it regularly (often daily, but at least weekly) ever since, enabling me to memorize hundreds of verses!

Scripture Typer has given me a renewed desire to spend time in God's Word and allow it to change me by memorizing it, reviewing it, and meditating on it regularly. Following are some of the practical reasons why I enjoy using Scripture Typer to help me do that.

- It's easy—It is user-friendly, quick, and simple. I don't have
 to type out each word (although I could choose to do that if I
 wanted to); I just type the first letter of each word and it fills
 in the rest of the word.
- It's convenient—I can take it with me on my phone or tablet wherever I go. I often use it while I walk on the treadmill each morning. It is available online for those who prefer to use a computer and keyboard.
- It's customizable—I can choose to memorize whatever verses I want and choose which of the 10 translations I want to memorize them in. There are over 50 preset categories of verses to choose from such as: Top 100 Verses, Hope, Forgiveness, or even The Books of the Bible. I can also create my own categories and add verses to them. Usually I memorize a single verse or a small section of verses, but it has also enabled me to memorize several small books of the Bible—something I never thought I would be able to do.
- It's creative—It includes various tools to assist in memorizing. My favorite is to draw an illustration of the verse I am memorizing to help me think through the verse and jog my memory. Other options include: recording yourself saying verses and then playing them back, using flash cards, or creating a group of people to memorize with.
- It's motivating—I find that it spurs me on by tracking my progress with stats, and providing incentives such as points and rankings. I don't like it when I have overdue verses highlighted in red. :) It is encouraging to see the thousands of other people around the world who are making time to memorize God's Word. Fun fact: Did you know that there are people who have memorized over 20,000 verses?
- It yields lasting results—Its built-in review process helps me to remember the verses I have memorized and not forget them over time. When I memorize a new verse, it comes up for review every day; then as I continue to get it right (90% accuracy or higher), the review interval changes to weekly, monthly, and then yearly. I have found that when a verse comes up for review, it is a good time for me to pause and meditate on what God is saying to me through that verse, and reflect back on when and/or why I chose to memorize it (such as a sermon that spoke to me, a temptation I was battling, a hard time I was going through, etc.).
- It's Free/Cheap!—Scripture Typer Lite is available to try for free and Scripture Typer Pro only costs \$10. Just search for Scripture Typer in your app store or visit scripturetyper.com.



Those are some of the reasons why I love using Scripture Typer to help me fill my mind with God's Truth. I recognize that it's one of many tools available for you to use, but it's one that has worked

really well for me. I encourage you to give it a try. Whatever tool or process you use, never underestimate the incredible value of time spent in God's Word and how the Holy Spirit can use it in incredible ways in your life! ■
