- Of those 41, 16 were from LCF and 25 were not from LCF.
- There were approximately 36 helpers each night (including youth volunteers).
- One new addition this year was an offering. A total of \$630 was collected to purchase audio Bibles for people in Mozambique. Praise the Lord! We were in awe of the generosity of our students, families, and helpers. The money raised is

enough to purchase 21 audio Bibles in Portugese.

In closing, there are several people to thank. Thank you to everyone who provided food and drinks. (A large portion of the food was donated, even more than usual.) Thank you to Sheila and Katy for investing so much time and energy into the week,

and thank you to everyone who helped out in so many ways to make such a great VBS! ■

What Do We Need? A Message from the Pastor by Rob Swartz

"They lifted their voices together to God..."

This is the response of the early church when they faced opposition to the gospel. I'm fascinated with this passage because it shows the church coming together in one voice,

calling out in complete dependence on God to help them carry out the mission God had given them.

On June 9th, in my message "Be Filled With the Holy Spirit," I asked you as a congregation to do a similar thing—"to come together in one voice" in a daily prayer of surrender, asking to be filled with and empowered by the Holy Spirit! (Listen to my message to understand what I mean by that.) I asked if you would join me in praying this every day this summer.

- We need a revival!
- We need a new desire to read and know the word of God—a people who devour God's Word every day-memorizing it, dwelling on it, speaking about it.
- We need a new boldness to share this amazing gospel.
- We need a dramatic shifting of priorities from trying to "do" everything and "have" everything in this world to truly surrendering our lives to God to allow him to "do" whatever he wants with us.
- We need to know how to stand for truth in a shifting world in a way that is not judgmental but strives to show the love of Christ to all
- We need to show the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, goodness, and self-control.
- We need to be a people of prayer, where we believe with all our hearts that God is able to act and to move in any situation we face.
- And these are just a few of the things we need. We need a revival!

These things are not going to happen on their own. They will not happen by our own will, or even desire. There isn't a program we can implement, a business model we can adopt, or a new leader we can hire, that will bring these about. These will only happen by the power of God, through his Holy Spirit in us. We see this clearly in the book of Acts, when on the day of Pentecost, the believers were filled with the Holy Spirit: they began to preach and teach with boldness; the church grew by leaps and bounds; they met together all the time; they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, to prayer, and to the fellowship of believers. We, too, need to be filled with the Holy Spirit. We need to be empowered and led by him.

And so...this article is simply to remind those of you who agreed to pray, and to invite others of you to pray, as well. Would you pray every day, during the months of June, July, and August, that we would be filled with the Holy Spirit; that we would surrender completely to him; that we would be empowered and led by him?

I love reminders, and I have a visual one for each of you who are committed to pray. It's a small silver dove which symbolizes the Holy Spirit. Each time I see it, I remember to pray with you and for us. I'd love to give one to you if it's helpful. Let me know if you'd like one. ©

After the early church "lifted their voices together to God" scripture tells us that "the place in which they were gathered was shaken and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." I don't know what will happen at LCF as a result of our prayers, but I believe we will, in some way, be shaken, and we will be filled with the Holy Spirit! ■

Council Update

At our meeting on June 18th, the council discussed our copier which was purchased in August 2010. It will soon be obsolete but it is still in good shape with relatively light use for the type of office copier it is. Parts and supplies are covered under our service agreement, but we pay for each copy, which has increased over the years. The council is looking into the option of keeping the copier and ways to save money going forward.

Financial donations were requested from local area CMC congregations for the Multiply Conference that will be held at Jonathan Alder in July. The council unanimously approved a \$500 contribution in addition to suppling bulletins for the children during the evening sessions.

There has been continued interest in the old church building; a low cash offer was countered in April and declined. Currently a prospective buyer is checking with Madison County about adding an additional structure before he makes an offer. Additional interested parties continue to inquire about the property.

Ray and Grace continue to manage the expenditures and budget as they plan the youth group's mission trip to Arizona in June. Airline tickets have been purchased and the youth group continues to look for additional resources through fundraisers and donations.

Olentangy Mennonite Church (OMC) is enjoying our second year of meeting together-inviting Jesus to change our lives and transform our communities. In the last year we have changed buildings, gained a few members, and welcomed many visitors into our worship spaces and homes.

As a church, we are currently studying the book of Ephesians. The letter starts by outlining our spiritual blessings in Christ. We are learning to be receptive of those blessings and to pray boldly for the spirit of wisdom and revelation in our knowledge of God. Ephesians has much to say about how God initiates, and then how we should respond. We are praying that as we study this book together, the immeasurable greatness of God's power would be realized in our lives and the lives of those around us.


Update from Anna
